

Railroad Scholarships

Several railroad scholarships are available to Michigan Tech students with interests in the railroad industry. Applicants are encouraged to apply for the AREMA, CSX Transportation, and Union Pacific Railroad scholarships.

American Railway Engineering and Maintenance of Way Association (AREMA) – Several Scholarships through Educational Foundation and Committees – At least 19 scholarships of min. \$1,000 each with total of \$24,000 or more for undergraduate engineering students with interests in railroad engineering (last year Michigan Tech students won 11 out of 24 scholarships).

Michigan Tech Alumni AREMA Scholarships - two scholarships of \$1000 for undergraduate or graduate engineering students at *Michigan Tech* with an interest in railroad engineering.

Application process for the AREMA scholarships: application materials are to be sent to AREMA by **March 13, 2009** and only one application is required for the AREMA scholarships. The application package is to include a cover letter, a resume, two letters of recommendation, and a transcript. Successful applicants will be informed of awards by the end of April.

Application process for the CSX Transportation and Union Pacific Railroad scholarships: applications materials are to be submitted by **March 6, 2009** to **Dr. Bill Sproule**, Michigan Tech Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, **301C Dillman Hall**. Only one application is required. The application package is to include a cover letter, a resume, two letters of recommendation, and a transcript. Successful applicants will be informed of awards by mid-April 2009 (award will be available for the Michigan Tech railroad engineering summer program).

Amount of Award: Each scholarship will be in the amount of \$1,000.

Application Process: To apply for the CSX Transportation and the Union Pacific Railroad scholarships the materials listed below must be submitted to Dr. Bill Sproule, Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, Michigan Tech University, by Thursday, March 6, 2009.

- the attached application form
- a cover letter giving reasons why the applicant believes he/she is deserving of a scholarship and demonstrate an interest in the railroad industry
- a resume
- two letters of recommendation
- a copy of your transcript

One application can be submitted to be considered for both CSX and Union Pacific scholarships. Successful applicants will be informed of awards by mid-April 2009.
